Unit Title	Why This Is Important and Why Is It Taught at This Point?
My World	<p><u>Student started this project in Year 10.</u></p> <p>This project titles “Junk” is part 2 of Component 1. This is worth 60% of pupils overall GCSE grade. In this project pupils will have the opportunity to create their own unique response to the theme “My World”. Pupils will learn how to develop their independence and imagination by choosing their own personal response to the theme. Previous students have explored ideas such as; Music, Motorsport, Food, and Identity – exploring a range of themes and mediums that they are interested in. They have connected this theme through to the work of Artists, which has inspired creative experimentation. This term, they combine and refine this experimentation into one final piece.</p>

Pupils will be given an exam paper which has 7 different titles for pupils to select from.
