JUNK	This project titles "Junk" is part 2 of Component 1. This is worth 60% of pupils overall GCSE grade. In this project pupils will have the opportunity to create their own unique response to the theme "Junk". Pupils will learn how to develop their indepdenace and imagination by choosing their own personal response to the theme. Previous students have explored ideas such as; Junk in the Ocean, Junk Food, Junk Yard – exploring tools in workshops and cars in scrap yards. This project is a much larger project and is an opportunity for students to showcase skills and knowledge learnt in the Natural Forms project in a more mature and sophisticated manner.
