Unit Title	Why This Is Important and Why Is It Taught at This Point?
Poetry	In this unit, students explore poetry from the 18 th Century to the present day. Students have the opportunity to show their understanding of a range of poems and the relationships between them and the contexts in which they were written. Students will build on their knowledge of poetry from KS3 poetry units. The poetry unit is broken up into two parts: half of the poems are studies in Year 10, and the other half in Year 11. Students read in depth, critically and evaluatively, so that they are able to discuss and explain their understanding and ideas. We aim for students to appreciate the depth and power of the English literary heritage. We aim for students to write accurately, effectively and analytically about their reading using Standard English. During this course, students acquire and use a wide vocabulary, including the grammatical terminology and other literary and linguistic terms they need to criticise and analyse what they read.
