	This is the second GCSE text that students study.
'A Christmas Carol' by Charles Dickens	In this unit, students explore classic literature in order to develop a good understanding of characterisation, plot, themes, language and the writer's purpose. Students look at the historical context of the novella, building on their knowledge from Year 8 in the 'Victorian novel' unit of work and the Year 9 'Jane Eyre' unit of work. Students read in depth, critically and evaluatively, so that they are able to discuss and explain their understanding and ideas. We aim for students to appreciate the depth and power of the English literary heritage. We aim for students to write accurately, effectively and analytically about their reading using Standard English. During this course, students acquire and use a wide vocabulary, including the grammatical terminology and other literary and linguistic terms they need to criticise and analyse what they read.
