STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

Our core values are, ready to learn, respectful, responsible and safe

READY:

I will make sure that I:

- 1) Model the school values of be ready, respectful, be responsible and safe at all times.
- 2) Arrive at school by 8.30am and get to all of my lessons on time.
- 3) Remain in class and school unless given direct permission by a member of staff to leave.
- 4) When leaving class wait for a member of staff to escort me to where I need to go.
- 5) Bring the equipment needed for learning.
- 6) Wear the correct uniform impeccably. No hoodies or coats to be worn inside the school building.
- 7) Do not wear excessive make up, false nails or false eye lashes.
- 8) Enter the classroom silently and calmy following the 'Meet and greet'.
- 9) Begin the Do Now activity.
- 10) Remain focused: concentrate on what the teacher is saying and the lesson content.
- 11) Always complete my classwork and homework on time.
- 12) Make sure I catch up on my learning if I am absent from school or have fallen behind for other reasons and attend intervention when directed.
- 13) Only drink water from a clear bottle. Do not eat, drink, or chew in the upstairs corridors.
- 14) Do not bring energy drinks or chewing gum into school.
- 15) Only use my mobile phone at break and lunchtime. It will be switched off and in my bag for the rest of the time.
- 16) Do not graffiti or doodle on my work, textbooks or the work of others.

BE RESPECTFUL: I will uphold the collective school rights:

At The Telford Priory School:

- Pupils will experience high quality classroom practice that allows **all** pupils to prosper and flourish and a classroom environment that is free from disruption.
- Everyone has the right to feel safe, listened to, treated fairly and to be free from discrimination.
- 17) Respect others by listening when they are speaking.
- 18) Do not distract others.
- 19) Support your peers and cooperate with others.
- 20) Think carefully about your choice of language.
- 21) Look after your belongings and respect those of other people
- 22) Do not abuse school property.
- 23) Help keep the school site and surrounding streets attractive by not dropping litter.
- 24) On your walk home and on buses you must behave appropriately and show respect for property and members of the community.

<u>BE RESPONSIBLE & SAFE: I will help create a safer school and wider community which</u> respects the rights of others by:

- 25) Listening to members of staff and following instructions immediately, politely and calmly without arguing.
- 26) Modifying my behaviour once a member of staff issues any form of warning and by completing the correction.

- 27) Walking around the building quietly, purposefully.
- 28) Keeping my hands and feet to myself.
- 29) Ensuring at breaktime I am either sat in the canteen or outside.
- 30) Going straight to my lessons and holding the doors open for others.
- 31) Not congregating in large groups inside or outside the building.
- 32) Respecting others by not making any comments that are homophobic, racist, or upsetting to others.
- 33) Respecting the property of my peers, and the school by never defacing the building, dropping litter, or spitting.
- 34) Never being physical, insulting, undermining, or swearing at anyone.
- 35) Remembering that I represent The Telford Priory School including within any online activity.
- 36) Leaving school and making my way home in an orderly, responsible way. This includes riding my bike safely and crossing the road in designated places.
- 37) Resecting those around me by speaking to my peers, transport staff and members of the public quietly and politely when on public transport.
- 38) Handing over requested items and allowing appropriate staff to search my bag/blazer when requesting to do so.
- 39) Respecting the local environment by being considerate to our local community for example by obeying the local shop rules, not dropping litter and not trespassing on private property.

USE OF SOCIAL MEDIA:

- Always be polite when communicating with others.
- Do not use abusive or offensive language towards others that may be humiliating and hurtful. Remember that Cyber-bullying can escalate and is potentially damaging to all involved.
- Do not post or distribute images or videos of others without their permission.
- Do not post or send inappropriate images or videos of yourself or others to anyone.
- Do not post offensive or inappropriate comments about the school or members of staff.
- Report any instances where you come across any information/images that you find upsetting.
- Do not meet with anyone you have met online without first checking with your parents. If they agree to the meeting, make sure it is in a public place and do not go alone, ideally taking a parent with you.
