Unit Title	Why This Is Important and Why Is It Taught at This Point?
Spoken Language	This is the final topic taught in Year 10. Students will take what they have learnt from the previous topic, English Language Paper 2, to write their own speech on a topic of their choice. They will be guided and supported by the teacher in their choice and the content of their topic. Students will then deliver their presentation in front of a live audience, their teacher and peers. Spoken language skills are often cited as essential by many employers; this is an opportunity to develop these skills and prove to a potential employer in the future.
