Dear Parent and Carers,

Firstly. I would like to thank you all for your understanding and support with the partial closure of the school to Years 7, 8, 9 and 10 on the strike day on Thursday this week and the strike day on Tuesday next week. I do not like having to close the school, but I had to take into consideration the health and safety of all staff and students. Hopefully, a resolution to this dispute will be found soon.

It has been a busy week at TPS with lots of things going on.

On Monday and Tuesday this week, we invited pupils from the local



primary schools to watch performances of our wonderful school production, back to the 80's. Over the two days we had a total of 500 children come and watch our drama and dance students perform the show. The children enjoyed the show and had a lovely afternoon. Our main

Also, on Tuesday some of our Y7 cohort visited Warwick Castle where they explored the castle



and grounds and found out all about the history of the castle and how it had changed over the centuries. Our students



engaged in exhibitions and activities at the castle, and they all found the trip informative and enjoyed the visit.



This Wednesday, some of our Y8 students visited Attingham Park, Shrewsbury as part of our outreach project with the National Trust. They had a really great time.

On Thursday some of our Y10 cohort visited Wolverhampton University where they had a tour of the campus and were given information on courses available through the University. These trips are extremely important to ensure our children know the range of things open to them.

You may be aware that we have been working with some students re: uniform for next year and I have been so impressed with the maturity of some of our student leaders in year 10 - they understand the need for a collective uniform and recognise that wearing their PE kit on some days has meant that some of our high standards have slipped. I have also had communications from parents re: this and the desire to have our standard uniform back.

The students have been working with us re: a relaunch of the

expectations, moving to full school uniform every day and have asked me to look at the introduction of pencil skirts, a zipped A4 size handbag and a school fleece. Furthermore, we are now in a position, following some internal changes, to give back our changing rooms to the PE team - I know Mr Morris is very happy to have this facility back after internal capacity pressures made it temporarily out of action to accommodate our growing school at short notice.

I am also introducing, following some consultation with students, a year and college tie which I have been able to secure funding for: all current year 7-10 students will be given a new school tie in September so this is one less thing you as parents will have to worry about! I am also looking at a bigger pot of money to support parents who may struggle to provide all of the uniform and equipment requirements - do watch this space. We are also going to have a uniform amnesty asking parents to return uniform items which no longer fit their child but are in good condition. Details will follow soon! Uniform and identity at our school is so important, and I want to thank the students who have worked with me on this, particularly Libby Cartledge and Sophie Ewing.

I would like to remind you that next Parent in Partnership meeting will be held on Thursday 11th May at 6pm and all parents and carers are welcome to attend. Minutes from the last meeting are on the website, so please do come and join us if you can.





Should I keep my Child off School?

- Students with good attendance are far more likely to be successful in school.
- High attendance rates are linked to high student achievement.
- Missing school causes children to fall behind academically.
- Attendance below 90% is considered persistent absence.

Three Important Questions to Ask:

- 1. Does the child's illness keep him or her from comfortably taking part in activities?
- 2. Does the sick child need more care than the staff can give without affecting the health and safety of other children?
- 3. Could the other children get sick from being near your child?

 If the answer to any of these questions is yes, then the child should NOT go to school.
