Dear Parents and Carers,

As I mentioned last week, thank you all for your understanding and support with the decision made to partially close the school to Years 7, 8, 9 and 10 on the strike days that took place on Thursday last week and Tuesday this week. This decision was not taken lightly, and I had to take into consideration the health and safety of all staff and students.

It has been a busy week at TPS as always.

Following on from the letter sent to you all about the wonderful opportunity for our students to take part in the Camp Kenya trip, I am very pleased to announce that we have received a good response about this trip with 62 families registering their interest; and on Tuesday we held an information evening where parents were given detailed information about the trip and the fundraising for it. It was an extremely positive evening, and our parents /carers were excited with the opportunity that this gives their children. Thank you to all those that attended.

Telford College has offered a fantastic opportunity for our students that wanted to get involved in their new environmental technologies scheme, as part of the net zero strategy; some of our Y9 students visited the college on Wednesday where they met with staff from their environmental technology rigs and received talks from the college on the future of net zero technology. Both our Y9 students and the members of staff that went on the trip found it very informative.

Also, on Wednesday we held our Y6 transition welcome evening where we welcomed families of the Y6 children who will be joining us in September to find out all about our school. It was lovely to see so many families attend, and we look forward to welcoming them in September.

Our Careers department is launching a brand-new project running in school alongside the University of Wolverhampton and the Council called "Steps to Success" for a small group of our Y10 students. It is a programme developed alongside several local partners to inspire young people into post-16 education and informing them of lots of career and study options within our local community. This will involve workshops in school with SYST, visits off-site to universities, colleges and sixth forms, and trips to local companies. It is planned to be one session a week for the rest of the term and is structured so that students will not miss out on their vital curriculum learning.

We held our Y8 Parent Consultation Evening this Thursday and saw lots of positive engagement. This is such a crucial time for the students as they make some really important decisions around their options. Do please talk with your children using the options booklets to ensure that they made the right decisions.

This Friday we held a tea party to celebrate the Coronation of King Charles, which included guests from within the local community. Though I couldn't attend, Ms Storer-Young told me it was a fabulous event. I am delighted to tell you that our very own Mr Crowson has been nominated for his dedication to School football! Should I keep my Child off School?

- Students with good attendance are far more likely to be successful in school.
- High attendance rates are linked to high student achievement.
- Missing school causes children to fall behind academically.
- Attendance below 90% is considered persistent absence.

Three Important Questions to Ask:

1. Does the child's illness keep him or her from comfortably taking part in activities?

2. Does the sick child need more care than the staff can give without affecting the health and safety of other children?

3. Could the other children get sick from being near your child?

If the answer to any of these questions is yes, then the child should NOT go to school.
