






## Rewards celebration afternoon


- Would you like to be invited to the rewards afternoon? If so, you need to meet this criteria:
- 100% attendance
- No behaviour logs
- From Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> May 23rd May.
- If you succeed you will be invited to a rewards afternoon on the last day of term period 5 and 6.













#### **Should I keep my Child off School?**

- Students with good attendance are far more likely to be successful in school.
- High attendance rates are linked to high student achievement.
- Missing school causes children to fall behind academically.
- Attendance below 90% is considered persistent absence.

#### **Three Important Questions to Ask:**

- 1. Does the child's illness keep him or her from comfortably taking part in activities?
- 2. Does the sick child need more care than the staff can give without affecting the health and safety of other children?
- 3. Could the other children get sick from being near your child?

  If the answer to any of these questions is yes, then the child should NOT go to school.
