<u>chuluf</u>	We are proud to share that we have been awarded the status of a 'School of Sanctuary' which makes us the first secondary school in Telford to be recognised as such.			
School of Sanctuary	A School of Sanctuary is one where all are committed to being welcoming and inclusive to refugees and people seeking asylum. Through this, awareness of the issues facing people in the asylum system is raised and misconceptions are challenged with the aim of building social cohesion at a very difficult time.			
	We were very grateful for your support at the start of term and very proud of how our students presented themselves in full uniform. All who attended looked ready to learn and behaved accordingly.			
Uniform	As the half term has progressed, some of your children's uniform has slipped and at the start of the new half term, we will be revisiting our expectations and supporting students to make the right choices. Anyone out of uniform will be expected to return home to change before being welcomed into school or they will be expected to use the clothing we have available. I am sure that with your support, your child will again understand the importance of looking ready to learn.			
Toilets	Contrary what may have been said in some quarters, toilets are available for students before school, at break and lunch, and after school. Every child with a toilet pass for a medical condition can access them at any time and any other child can request the toilet. What we have acted on is the number of students using a toilet break to miss learning and this is both legitimate and in their best interests.			
	What we ask is that you speak to your child about using social time to use the toilet and allow learning time to be uninterrupted. In that way, their learning journey will be much smoother and allow them to excel.
