Well done Year 11 for reaching the end of what has been a difficult few years. From my conversations with many of you, you all seem positive about the new challenges you are about to face and the next steps you will be taking with your education and future careers.

If Results Day doesn't go as planned, please don't panic... there are lots of people around you to help! For the majority of people, the answer will be to drop down a course level – this is absolutely fine and gives you the chance to re-sit a subject if you need to. Both myself and Future Focus will continue to support you into those first few weeks at your new provider and we are happy to have conversations with you into September. Some of you may decide to change course, which is also expected by the providers and they will support you to do so.
